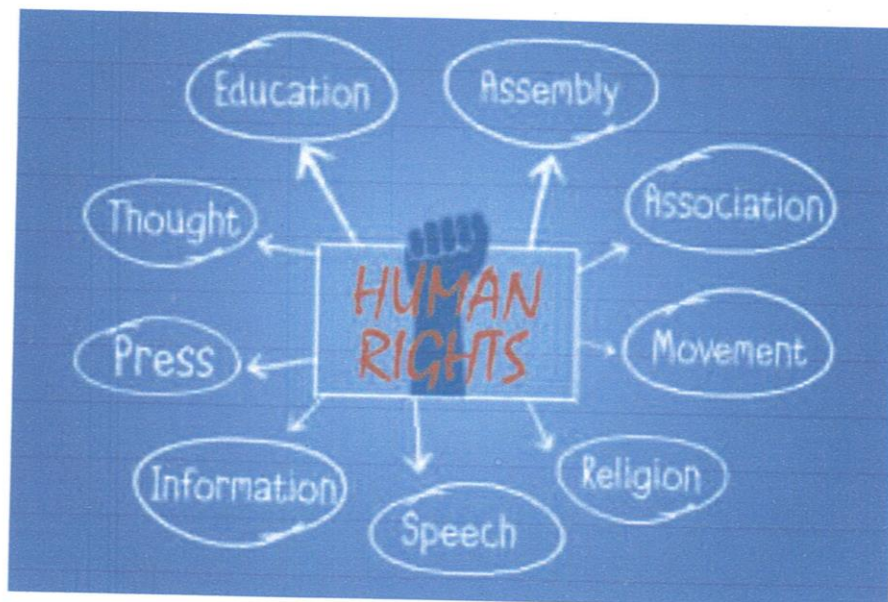

**Introduction:**

This course has been designed to give students an insight of perspectives of Human Rights. The course will enhance their expertise over the subject and will be an important value addition to the CV. This course is designed by the people having expertise over the subject matter and every module is prepared in simple language. The study group comprise principal and subject expert from the college, particularly the faculty with specialization in human rights.

Human Rights are those rights which every human being enjoys on the basis of equality irrespective of caste, race, religion, place of birth, sex or any other economic and social status. These rights are guaranteed under the constitution of India in the form of Fundamental Rights and Directive Principles of State Policy. Human rights are based on the principle of respect for the individual. Their fundamental assumption is that each person is a moral and rational being who deserves to be treated with dignity. They are called human rights because they are universal. Whereas nations or specialized groups enjoy specific rights that apply only to them, human rights are the rights to which everyone is entitled—no matter who they are or where they live—simply because they are alive. There is no question these are important rights, but the full scope of human rights is very broad. They mean choice and opportunity. They mean the freedom to obtain a job, adopt a career, select a partner of one's choice and raise children. They include the right to travel widely and the right to work gainfully without harassment, abuse and threat of arbitrary dismissal. They even embrace the right to leisure.

The main Aims and objectives of the 'Certificate Course in Human Rights' are as follows:

### **Aims & Objectives: -**

1. To enhance Human Right knowledge among students.
2. To give information about the history of human rights and modern human rights as well.
3. To create awareness about moral, ethical, social and democratic values.
4. To cultivate social welfare from the awareness of Human right.
5. To spread information about Human Rights and Duties.
6. To inform the learner about Human Rights issues and develop basic understanding of Human Rights and their enforcement.
