Introduction

At the global level, human activities have caused and will continue to cause a loss in biodiversity. Change in climate exert additional pressure and have already begun to affect biodiversity. Climate change is projected to affect all aspects of biodiversity; however, the projected changes have to take into account the impacts from past, present and future human activities. The general effect of projected human-induced climate change is that the habitats of many species will move pole ward or upward from their current locations. The changes in the frequency, intensity, extent and locations of disturbances will definitely affect but how what rate the existing ecosystem will be replaced by new animal and plant assemblages will be unpredictable.

Globally by the year 2080 about 40% of biodiversity could be lost. The risk of extinction will increase for many species that are already vulnerable. Where significant ecosystem disruption occurs, there may be losses in net ecosystem productivity (NEP) at least during the transition period. Changes in biodiversity at ecosystem and landscape scale, in response to climate change and other pressure would further affect global and regional climate. Changes in biodiversity in response to climate change is present significant challenges.

We need healthy and productive ecosystems to benefit from the multiple environmental, economic and social benefits they provide. Ecosystem restoration offers the opportunity to effectively halt and reverse degradation, improve ecosystem services and recover biodiversity. There are many different facets of restoration ecology, and they include practices such as erosion control, reforestation and revegetation (or replanting the native species of plants), removal of non-native species and reintroduction of native animal species.

The effectiveness of adaptation and mitigation activities can be enhanced when they are integrated with broader strategies designed to make development path more sustainable.

Objectives of the Webinar:

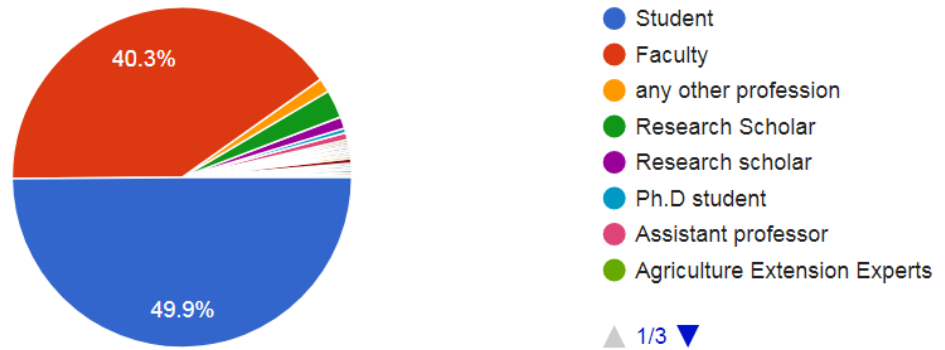

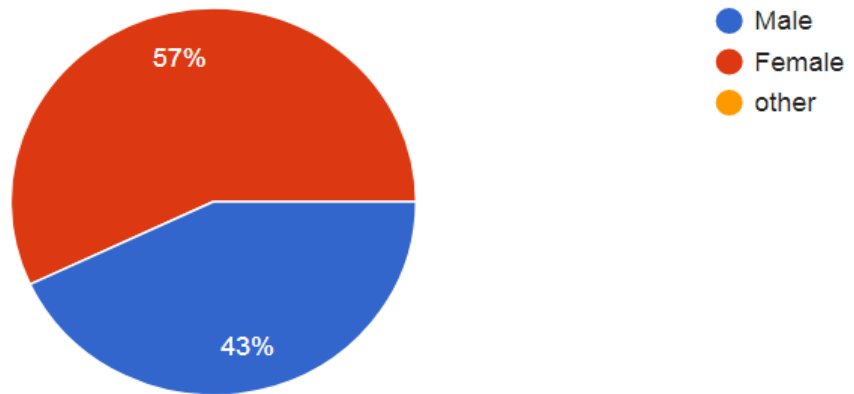
Which category of participant you belong to?

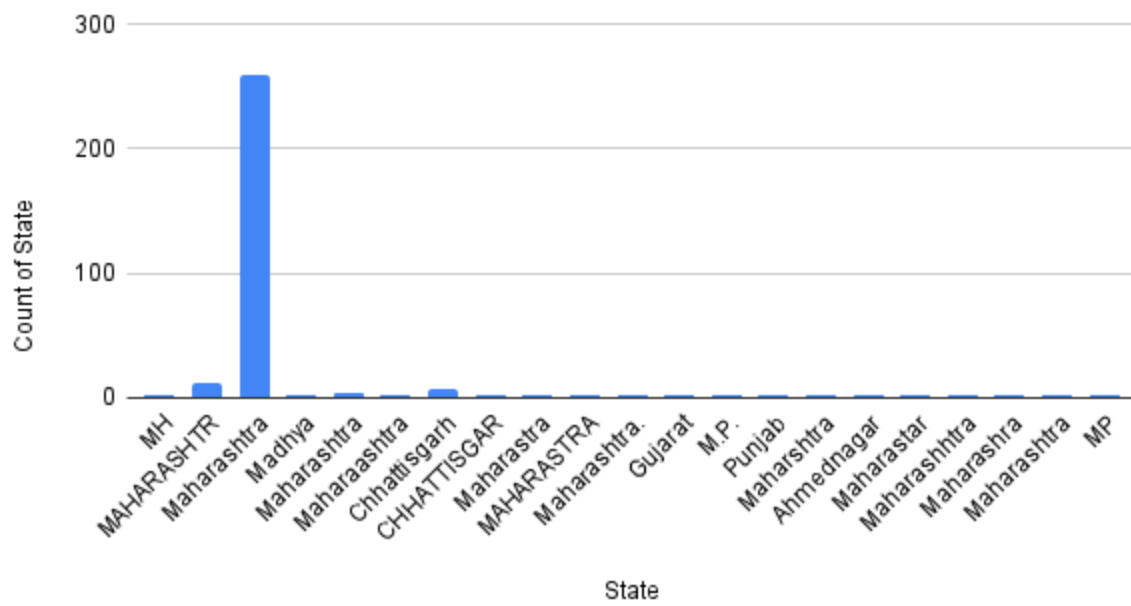

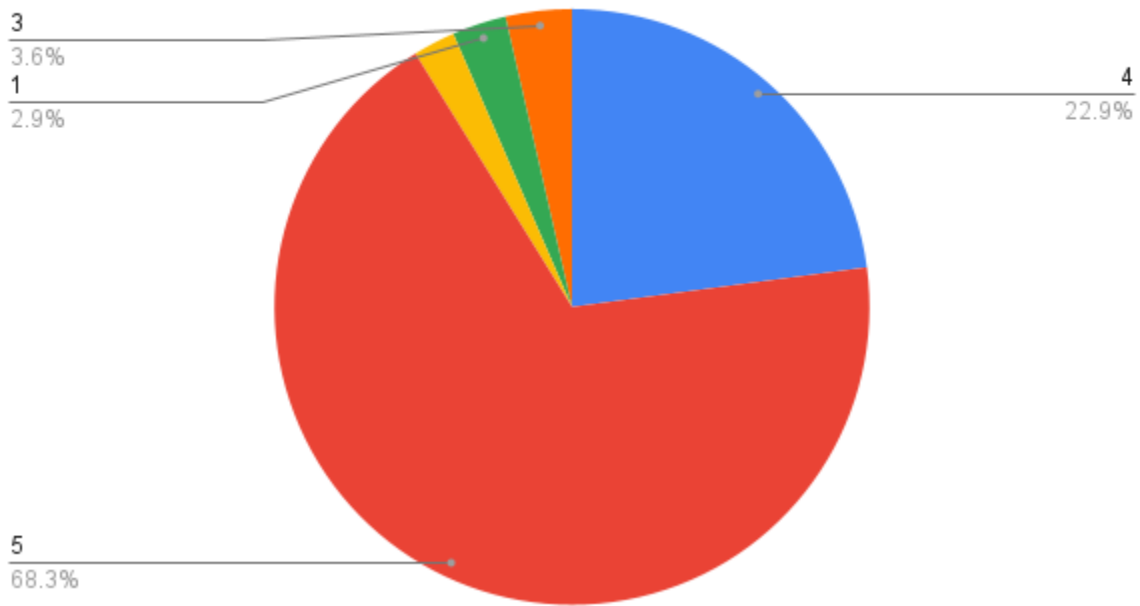

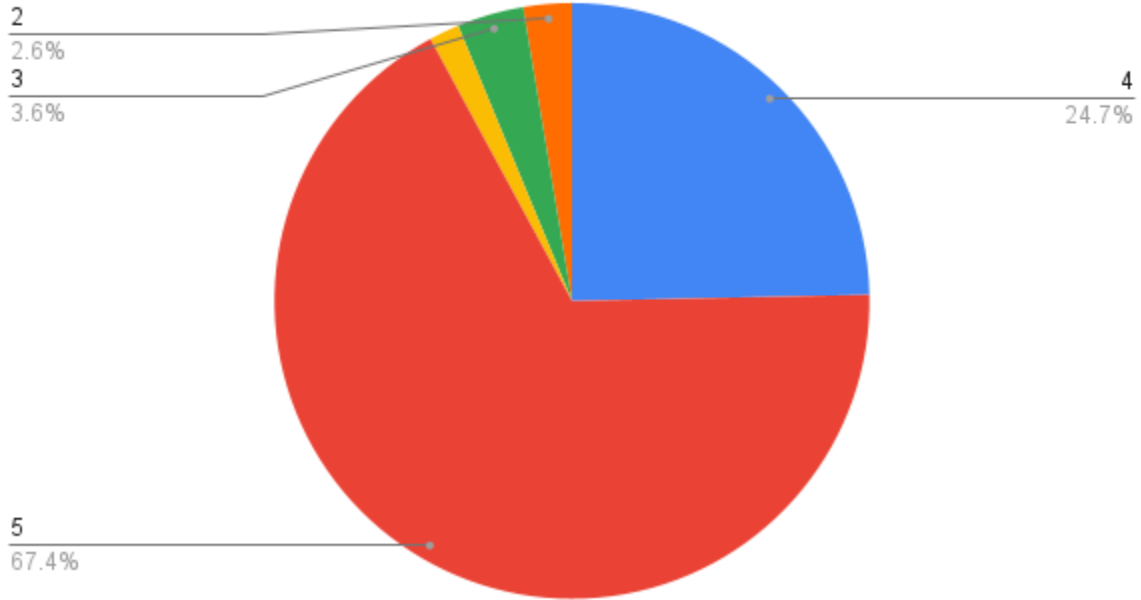
Count of State



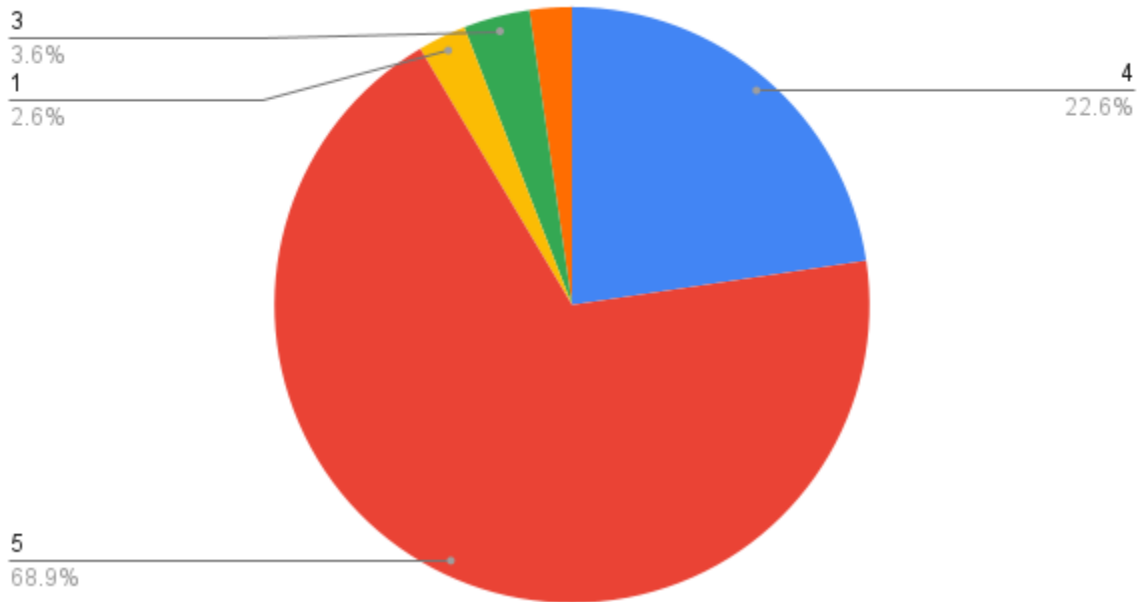
Count of How would you rate the overall webinar experience?

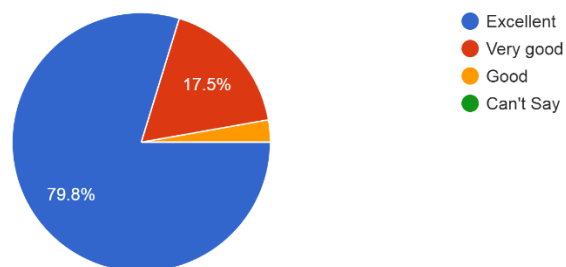
